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Why are we on strike in youth centres?

Thousands of us who work in youth centres are currently exercising our right to strike.

Why have we reached this point? Because there is no progress in bargaining talks and **the Couillard government is attacking our youth centres by imposing millions of dollars in budget cuts.**

Our youth centres are having more and more trouble responding quickly and efficiently to the needs of vulnerable young people and their families.

- Personnel are experiencing disturbing situations of distress, notable the worst rates of sick leave and major turnovers in staff.
- Rates of reports to the Director of Youth Protection are increasing from year to year, but personnel is reduced and budgets cut.
- The network of youth centres is less and less able to ensure services for vulnerable young people.

Meanwhile, we are rushing all the time to try and give you the best possible services.

Job abolitions, the non-replacement of people who are off sick and budget cuts are some of

the causes of the outrageous increases in our workloads.

Providing you with quality services takes time. We have the necessary expertise and all we want is to do our best. To succeed in doing so, we have to improve our quality of life at work.

The current attacks are too important for us to simply stay on the sidelines and ignore. This is why we have made the difficult decision to go on strike.

- **Because the worst that could happen to the health-care system would be for us to stand by, arms crossed, while the public system undergoes the worst dismantling we have ever seen!**
- **Because the government refuses to turn to new sources of revenue to fund our public services – for example, by putting an end to P3s and the use of the private sector, or by establishing a fully public drug insurance plan!**
- **Because the government wants to make workers poorer at a time of growing social inequalities!**
