



THE CSN IS WORKING FOR RECOGNITION OF INTERVENTION OFFICERS

The CSN, a force to be reckoned with for intervention officers

The CSN set up a working committee to intervene more effectively in favour of better recognition of the work done by intervention officers.

Various concerns have been at the heart of the committee's work, with the participation of a number of intervention officers. Recognition and valuing of the work, the role and responsibility of intervention officers, the legal framework for intervention and occupational health and safety issues were all concerns raised by intervention officers.

The working committee's mandate was to prepare a status report on the situation and reality of intervention officers' work.

One of the conclusions reached by committee members was the need to establish measures encouraging the attraction and retention of personnel. The intervention officers on the committee also want training for intervention officers to be standardized.

The committee proposed reviewing the assessment of the legal framework for intervention, with a view to establishing a procedure for handling complaints filed against an officer. Finally, the

committee is demanding that intervention officers have the status of sworn peace officers.
